## VALLEY PATRIOT OF THE MONTH

World War II Vet Arthur Ducharme Sr. - US Navy; Beach Party Team 12

Dracut's Arthur Ducharme Sr. is a US Navy World War II Pacific Theater Veteran. He turned ninety-six on April 1st of this year. Arthur is the older brother of World War II Veteran, Joseph Alfred Ducharme, who served as a Military Police Officer at the Nuremburg trials in Germany and was featured last summer in the Valley Patriot.

Growing up in Pelham, New Hampshire, Arthur left school after completing the eighth grade to support his family, after his father died. His dad was electrocuted in an industrial accident, leaving behind a wife, four daughters and three sons. Arthur was the oldest at the time, and the burden fell on him, as a young teenager, to support the family, working at the American Woolen Company in Lawrence and Dracut, Massachusetts.

Like many of his generation, his life was altered by the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. Arthur joined the US Navy in March of 1943, reporting for training at the Sampson Naval Base in Romulus, New York. He contracted spinal meningitis while in Basic training, and nearly died. He was sent home for thirty days medical leave, then returned to finish basic training. After graduation, his entire training company was sent to Amphibious training at Little Creek, Virginia and Fort Pierce, Florida.

The wartime needs of the Navy, overrode any personal training desires. Half of Arthur's Recruit Company were selected to be Radiomen, the other half to become Signalmen. The US Navy Radiomen were responsible for transmitting and receiving radio signals and processing all forms of telecommunications through various transmission media aboard ships, aircraft and at shore facilities. US Navy Signalmen were responsible for transmitting, receiving, encoding, decoding, and distributing messages obtained via the visual transmission systems of flag semaphore, visual Morse code, and flag hoist signaling.

With a two-ocean war waging against Germany, Italy, and Japan, the US Military put very little effort into finding out what a recruit's educational background or aptitude was, the



Greatest Generation simply learned the skills needed to defeat the Axis powers. After the war, Arthur learned that the other half of his US Navy Signalmen classmates, were shipped to the European Theater and participated in the invasion of Normandy.

Arthur found himself assigned to Beach Party 12, attached to a unit of US Army Engineers, at Camp Picket, Virginia. His team was sent by rail to Camp Stoneman, California, and embarked on a US Navy LST (Tank

The Valley Patriot will never refer to Latinos as “Latinx” no matter what the social fad is this week.

# Some Legislation I Am Filing This Session

The Massachusetts House of Representatives is in high gear working on newly filed legislation and passing a state budget. I have filed new bills this session pertaining to the environment, public safety, substance abuse prevention, mental health, Veterans, our National Guard, and more.

One issue I am working to address involves promoting reuse and recycling industries in Massachusetts. Recycling has become very costly and inaccessible for our cities and towns, and we need to find ways to strengthen recycling industries locally. This will save costs and reduce pollution from waste incineration, while also promoting economic growth.

I am also continuing work on the issue of combined sewer overflows (CSOs). Last session, the Merrimack Valley won a major victory when legislation I filed was signed into law requiring public notification of CSOs. This session, I have filed legislation to ensure wastewater treatment plants have sufficient back-up power to avoid discharging sewage during a power outage.

Our Veterans and National Guard members continue to be a priority. I have filed legislation with Rep. David Vieira of Falmouth to establish a memorial in the State House to historic woman Veteran Deborah Samson, who disguised herself as a man to fight in the Revolutionary War. I have also filed a bill to support National Guard members and their families who are relocating to Massachusetts by expanding their professional and educational opportunities.

As Chair of the Joint Committee on Advanced Information Technology, the Internet and Cybersecurity, I will also be reviewing legislation this session related to high-speed Internet access, data privacy, cybersecurity, the digital economy, and more. These issues affect us all on a daily basis and are essential to our economic growth and workforce development. I look forward to addressing these topics alongside my co-chair Senator Barry Finegold.

Additionally, the Special Oversight Committee that I chair to investigate the Holyoke Soldiers’ Home COVID-19 outbreak is wrapping up its investigation and will soon release legislative recommendations to ensure that this kind of tragedy never happens again.



The Massachusetts House also just passed its version of the state budget, which makes robust investments in our economic recovery and provides support for those who have been most affected by the pandemic. This includes increased funding for local aid, education, housing, food security, social services, and businesses. More to come on this topic.

I was proud to secure funding for local programs in Methuen, Haverhill, and the Merrimack Valley, including for student mental health services, addiction recovery resources, efforts to support at-risk youth and reduce gang violence,

park improvements, cultural center renovations, and support for our business community. The budget now goes to the Senate.

# So Few Restaurants Get it Right - Here Are Three

Since businesses have reopened from the Coronavirus lockdowns, we have noticed that most of the restaurants we used to love to go to are now mailing it in. While we understand that service is not going to be as good as it was before the lockdowns as managers struggle to get more help, there is really no excuse for wrong orders, cold food, portions much smaller, while prices have gone up. Of the 10 restaurants we visited in the last month (some we have been going to faithfully for years) we can report only three of those restaurants did a good enough job to make our Above and Beyond list.

Rather than shame those restaurants that are getting it wrong by mentioning them by name, we thought it would help the community if they gave a free review to those restaurants that have stepped up their game since the lockdowns in the hopes that other restaurants will follow their example.

We walked into Tomo at the busiest time of night. Friday at 8pm. The place was completely full but there was only a 10-minute wait for a table. By the time we placed our drink order at the bar our table was ready.

The appetizers came out quicker than we expected and our glasses were never empty before the waitress refilled them. Most hibachi restaurants don't really serve the best sushi. What they excel in at the hibachi table they usually lack in the sushi department. So, we weren't expecting much when we ordered the sushi, but were pleasantly surprised by the time we were

done. So much so, that we ordered more, even though we were about to have a hibachi meal.

We ordered the Emperor's Delight and the Steak and Lobster dishes. First off, HUGE deep-sea scallops. For that alone we would be giving them high marks and committed to going back. They were tender, they were cooked perfectly, and they fell apart in our mouths.

The steak was also cooked perfectly and the rice, well you have to try to understand how good that was because we are at a loss for words on that one.

What's more, the portions were so big that we almost didn't finish it all. But instead of trying to rush us out towards the end of meal like most restaurants do, they let us hang around and take our time. By the time we were ready to leave there was literally nothing on anyone's plate.

In full disclosure Tomo's is an advertiser in this newspaper. But we assure you if we didn't think this experience was exceptional, we just would have left them out.

There was no wait. The first thing we noticed when we sat down at Orzo was that the menu had not really changed since before the lockdowns. Many restaurants have trimmed down their menus and eliminated popular items to save money on inventory as they try to financially recover before we get back to normal.

As appetizers go, it's hard to find a restaurant that

cooks calamari just right. Most places overcook it to the point where it's almost too rubbery to chew. Even seafood places that specialize in calamari usually cook it just a little too much. So, we normally do not judge a place for the calamari, but when we find a restaurant that serves calamari just right it's worth passing the word along to our readers.

It's also very difficult lately to find a place that will make steak the way we ask for it. The three restaurants we visited earlier in the week all got the steak order wrong. So, when we ordered steak at Orzo we weren't expecting much. We were both pleasantly surprised when both our steak orders were made to our liking, and when we looked at the menu it seemed like the price was actually lower than it was before the lockdowns. The portions also seemed bigger than before the lockdowns.

What's more, the service was exceptional. The waitress kept our drinks full, was very attentive despite being very busy, and there was no 20-minute wait after our meal was delivered like at the other restaurants we visited that week. It was a pleasant experience. Now, a restaurant that was never on our GO-TO list is now near the top of that list.

## 40 Year Anniversary of the Still Unexplained Death of Elias J. Menkes MD at New England Deaconess Hospital

Elli had stopped at the hospital, before returning home from February break looking happier than all week away from his patients. He had been hired the previous year, barely 31 years old, as co-director of Intensive Care and director of Respiratory Therapy at the New England Deaconess Hospital for his many accomplishments in medicine. A job, unbeknownst to him, zealously coveted by a more senior colleague and surgeon there, Peter B., who vowed to make his life miserable for it and proceeded to do so. The reason we had spent our vacation contemplating a job offer Elli had received from Merck Pharmaceuticals to head their research facility in Switzerland.

"You should have seen for yourself," Elli said, still in the doorway of our apartment "when I arrived my patients looked like they were wilting. When I left, they were thriving like beautiful flowers in a garden." Asked how he had managed this transformation so quickly he said: "I tried to imagine what caused each patient the most acute discomfort and how it could be alleviated immediately. No fancy new technology, just adding a pillow or blanket, or removing it, - holding a hand, stroking a cheek." Elli lived to heal the sick, in fact the sickest. He worked at his research because he desperately wanted to find a cure for a hospital acquired pneumonia that killed his most fragile patients. But his calling was treating those patients. We both believed that his famed congeniality would eventually bring the combative surgeon around. But we were wrong. Peter B., having been at the Deaconess longer, had support among the medical staff to fight the newcomer every step of the way, even up to demanding that stabilized patients be kept in the ICU to the detriment of the more gravely ill who had to wait for critical intervention lying in corridors. An unconscionable condition that finally caused Elli to write a cautionary letter to his superior. Several weeks later his research was destroyed, wiping out years of hard work and his hope for that

imminent cure. There was talk of an "inside job" signaling a personal threat directed at him and we began reconsidering the job offer from Merck. But that was not to be.

The last time I saw Elli alive was on the most beautiful sunny Saturday morning of May 2, 1981 when I walked him to the elevator in our apartment building while our daughters aged 4 and 9 watched a show on TV. Elli had gone for Clinical Rounds, as customary on Saturdays, but didn't return home. By midday I had called is beeper several times and by 2:00 pm I phoned a colleague whom he considered somewhat friendly. Peter M. arrived with his wife and 2 daughters to pick me up, leaving his family with our children. Hospital security accompanied us to Elli's office, where I saw a figure resembling him slumped sideways in his chair. Dead, I was told, by suicide. A hospital psychiatrist Paul H. at the site explained that Elli had been diagnosed with Leukemia and apparently chosen to kill himself rather than suffer the disease. Nothing of what I saw or heard made sense to me. Least of all that this look-alike figure was Elli, had contracted a deadly disease I knew nothing about and that he had killed himself without any indication of a Leukemia diagnosis in his medical records. A man devoted to saving lives!

A special two-man police unit serving the Deaconess was called several hours later in accordance with the hospital's inside policy and recorded: "unexplained death." Years later they testified that they had not heard the Leukemia story but of an alleged affair I supposedly had with a doctor at the hospital, that Elli was to have walked in on that morning. Obviously, they hadn't believed it as they never called me to verify this grotesque lie, nor did they inquire who the affair doctor was, as they told me. The state medical examiner, George W. Katsas, notorious, for his indifference to accuracy and prone to corruption, obediently stated "suicide" on Elli's death certificate while omitting essential data.

Coincidence brought me together with two men who had worked for Deaconess Security and present May 2, 1981. Both expressed relief to relate to me their observations that caused them to disbelieve the cause of Elli's death to have been a suicide. One of them summoned by a nurse to Elli's office to "officially record the time of opening his door, although it was apparent (to him) that she had to have been inside already, given her behavior." As suspect as was the reason and the mode of Elli's alleged suicide, so were the ever-mounting questions. The file I went to pick up from the law office on a workman's comp case I eventually filed and which was denied, missed crucial documents as well as the tape with testimonies by the two witnesses. Why was this evidence removed and who had it been given to? Elli's adversary Peter B. up and left when the claim was filed, not only the job he was given literally over Elli's dead body, but the hospital and Massachusetts altogether, after having lived here all his life. Why?

William Hogen, Homicide Investigator at the DA's office, who reviewed Elli's file told me: "Get an SOB lawyer." But I had worn out my heart and shoes running from authority to authority. Another lawsuit was not what I wanted. I had children to raise and jobs to manage. In 2018 I wrote to DA Conley, begging him to investigate Elli's death prior to leaving his post to give us closure but he never answered my letters. The white wall protecting hospital transgressions is particularly resistant here due to Massachusetts politics, as I learned. Nevertheless, I have written to Conley's successor DA Rollins, appealing to her commitment to reform our criminal justice system and I am again waiting to hear whether she will finally investigate the facts of this 40-year conspiracy. To our family Elli's death is acute, devastating and unexplained.

Speaking of housing, don't forget the scandal at the Dracut Housing Authority and the 217 phone calls between John Zimini and Mike McLaughlin. According to the Sun, "Zimini did not return multiple calls seeking comment for this story."

Meanwhile, Phil Thibault recently said Dracut is starting to rot. He and John Zimini should look in the mirror. Thibault has benefitted financially from his affiliation with Dracut Access Television (DATV).

As reported in the Lowell Sun, Phil Thibault and his friends passed a confidentiality agreement to place a shroud of secrecy over DATV. ## WEATHER 101 with AL KAPRIELIAN

## The Last Month of Spring

Welcome to May and the last full month of the spring season. During May the days continue to get longer and the nights shorter. Also, daily high temperatures increase as we go through May due to the sun angle continuing to get higher and more direct. We can reach 90 degrees in May especially away from the coast most especially the south coast, Cape Cod & the Islands.

These locations remain much cooler due to the still chilly ocean waters. During May as the trees continue to bloom with their leaves, pollen levels can rise significantly especially if there is a stretch of days with no rain.

Recapping April we saw some chilly days at the start of the month and also around the middle of the month. Snow occurred in April on the 16th. The heaviest snowfall occurred over the higher terrain areas like the Berkshire, Worcester hills, Monadnock region of New Hampshire as well as northern New Hampshire.

Due to the time of year, the snow was wet and heavy. Many high terrain areas saw over 8" of wet and heavy snow. Some areas saw 12-14". Due to the weight of the snow on trees and power lines, this caused numerous power outages as the heavy snow caused tree branches and power lines to fall. Mostly rain fell in the lower elevations, however, some light snow accumulation did occur. Prior to this we saw some warm weather on April 10th. This was one of the warmest days of the month with many areas away from the south coast, Cape Cod & the Islands getting into the upper 70s. A cold front came through on April 21st late in the day.

Prior to the cold frontal passage, temperatures reached the low 70s. Severe weather occurred ahead of the cold front with an EFO tornado occurring at 2:49pm April 21st in Kent Connecticut which is located near the New York border in western Litchfield County. E stands for Enhanced. FO is the weakest tornado on the Fujita scale. An F5 tornado is the highest on the scale and the most destructive.

On April 21st in our area, we did see some downpours along with thunder and lightning. Most of the severe weather occurred in western Massachusetts and Connecticut where the atmosphere was more favorable for the development of severe weather. Behind the cold front, very windy and cold air moved in during the night of April 21st into the 22nd. Clouds with some peeks of sun occurred with chilly temperatures on April 22nd.

We even saw some snow flurries on that day due to moisture streaming in off the Great Lakes. During the last week in April, summer warmth was over much of

the eastern United States, Mid-Atlantic region, westward through Ohio into the Midwest states but did not make it into our region.

The warm front stalled to our south & west. On Tuesday April 27th, high temperatures reached well into the 70s to near 80 degrees in Connecticut. This warm air with the feel of summer was blocked by an old storm in the Canadian Maritimes.

Upper-level winds out of the northwest around the storm to our northeast ran parallel to the warm front causing it to stall and not make it through our part of New England. Temperatures stayed in the 50s on the north/northeast side of the front especially along the coast with winds blowing off the cold ocean.

Ocean temperatures in late April were still in the middle 40s. A low pressure system moving along this stalled stationary front gave parts of New England some beneficial rain on Thursday April 29th. The heaviest rain occurred in areas along and especially north of the MA Pike.

This is where the rising motion of the air (lift) was more enhanced north of the stalled stationary front. Remember the more the air rises the more rain occurs due to condensation. Much less rain occurred south of the MA Pike including Cape Cod & the Islands. On the last day of the month on April 30th this low pressure and its associated cold front moved away from our area.

We saw drier, however, very windy conditions during the afternoon with some areas in Massachusetts gusting to 50 miles per hour and higher. These strong winds did cause some trees and power lines to fall resulting in some power outages.

The reason for the strong winds was that the low-pressure system that gave us the rain really became intense as it got into the Canadian Maritimes. As April came to a close, we saw some chilly temperatures along with the strong winds. As is typical in the spring we can get into a blocking pattern in relation to the upper-level winds.

With the blocking pattern, high pressure in the upper atmosphere gets stuck (stalls) in the North Atlantic Ocean up into Greenland. This block in the upper levels causes the jet stream to track south of us putting us on the north, chilly and at times wet side of the Jet Stream. Will this blocking pattern weaken and break down in May so we can get into the summer warmth with high temperatures in the 70s and 80s?

Stay tuned to next month's article for the answer. In the meantime, stay safe and enjoy the spring season!!! ◇

## Anthony Holloway of Methuen Pleads Guilty to Distributing Fentanyl

BOSTON – A Methuen man pleaded guilty yesterday in federal court in Boston to fentanyl distribution charges.

Anthony Holloway, 39, pleaded guilty to conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute fentanyl. U.S. District Court Judge William G. Young scheduled sentencing for April 26, 2022, when Holloway is set to complete the Court-run RISE (Repair, Invest, Succeed, Emerge) Program, which is designed to aid in the rehabilitation of applicable defendants who have pleaded guilty and are under pretrial supervision prior to sentencing. In December 2019, Holloway was arrested and charged with co-defendant Steven Perez, who was sentenced in February 2021 to 70 months in prison.

Over the course of several months, agents investigated Perez and Holloway's fentanyl distribution operation. Perez and Holloway sold fentanyl to a confidential informant. Upon an execution of a search warrant at Perez's residence, agents seized 61 grams of fentanyl.

The charge of conspiracy to distribute and to possess with intent to distribute fentanyl carries a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison, at least three years of supervised release and a fine of up to \$1 million. Sentences are imposed by a federal district court judge based upon the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Philip C. Cheng of Mendell's Narcotics and Money Laundering Unit is prosecuting the case.

LAWRENCE'S ACTING MAYOR MAKES RACIST COMMENTS TO DISTRACT FROM LAWRENCE'S FAILURES

So was the case this month when a member of the Massachusetts board of education rightfully called Lawrence educators to task for chronically failing the children of Lawrence.



or that Moriarty thought "immigrants are lazy", he simply saw the color of his skin and attacked him as a racist because he said what Vasquez didn't want to hear.

Vasquez didn't commit to turning around the schools, he didn't offer any solutions, he just relied on the "dog whistle" propaganda hoping all this will just go away. [A "dog whistle" is what political activists call a veiled racist statement meant only for those fellow racists to get the message, while everyone else only hears a benign statement.]

Yet there was nothing veiled or racist about the comments Moriarty made.

This is why government never solves any real problems, especially in Lawrence.



# DCF Must be Reformed

Hello Valley Patriot Readers,

In late March, we were all devastated to learn of the tragedy involving David Almond, the 14-year-old autistic boy who died last October after being found living in abhorrent conditions.

Fall River police went to the Almond house after receiving a report of an unresponsive person. There, officers found David, bruised, emaciated and living in squalor under the care of his father, who, alongside his girlfriend, were arrested and indicted on charges of second-degree murder.

The loss of David's life was completely preventable and the result of a series of systemic breakdowns over a long period of time. These missteps were highlighted in a recent report by the Office of the Child Advocate that shined a spotlight on the state Department of Children and Families' (DCF) failed response to a series of red flags, including forgoing an investigation when an anonymous tip alleged neglect in the Almond household.

DCF had long been involved with the Almond household, removing David and his brothers from their father's care in 2017. Yet, they would return to Fall River last year, just as the COVID-19 pandemic hit. DCF's supervision over the reunification was negligible, as they conducted only virtual visitation and did not bother to follow up when David and his brothers did not return to school. DCF also failed to investigate injuries David suffered, involving a wound to his face.

DCF's complete failure to protect David was not only unacceptable – it was shameful.

There is no shortage of reforms to be implemented.

For one, the current workforce training curriculum to assess safety and risks to a family is clearly not working and must be overhauled. DCF workers need access to better training in helping children with disabilities who, all too often, are more likely to be maltreated

than those without disabilities. There seemed to be no understanding from DCF of the impact David's disability would play.

Several bills have been filed this session around reform at DCF.

House Bill 88, An Act relative to accountability for vulnerable children and families, establishes a "bill of rights" to help recruit and retain foster parents, updates reunification reviews and requires DCF to establish a formal review process prior to a decision to reunify children. The bill also requires DCF to notify a child or young adult's attorney of changes in placement or if the child or young adult is involved in a 51A abuse or neglect report, and the agency under the bill is also required to review policies to improve protocol for complex cases involving multiple social workers and area offices.

Senate Docket 2581, An Act to protect children, would require DCF to conduct a comprehensive review of the department's practices related to individuals with disabilities and develop a policy to promote positive changes; develop a new reunification policy by setting minimum standards that must be met; review current processes for safety assessment and then develop an evidenced-based process for assessing safety issues, with minimum set standards; and develop guidance and training for their workforce with specific set written standards and policies.

Our youngest and most vulnerable need our help and we need to take bold action. These are just some of the reforms that must be implemented at DCF and I will continue to push hard for their passage.

every booth, giving us maximum privacy. For us that's huge. Any time we can find a restaurant that has seating which keeps us away from other people, it's a big bonus. But it's even better when we find a place that offers almost exclusive privacy at our booth, and Joe Fish did that.

Prior to the lockdowns we used to get the fried fisherman's platter and noticed it wasn't on the menu anymore. The only thing listed was a baked platter.

When the waitress took our order, I told her I liked it better when they had the fried platter on the menu and she said it was no problem, they would be happy to make it for me. I had to order the clams separately, but I was thrilled that they were willing to make something not on the menu.

While we were still not happy with the fact that they are still serving baby scallops (deep sea is the way to go 100% of the time) the platter was still great.

The portions were big, the appetizers

were great, and the service was exceptional. Most of the restaurants we visited in the last month were very inattentive, and seemed like they couldn't get away from our table fast enough.

At one restaurant, I still had two more things I was going to order besides the meal, but after the waitresses heard my meal order they fled our table so fast we thought there was a fire. That wasn't a problem at Joe Fish.

Despite the fact that we were there on a Saturday night and they were very busy, our waitress spent a lot of time with us, she was on top of everything from keeping our glasses full, to making sure that we got milk for our coffee instead of cream (something most restaurants get wrong).

We were so happy with our experience that we actually went back a few days later for steamers and lobster and again it was all to our liking. ♦

First Dose of Chinese Covid-19 Vaccine Offers Little Protection, Chile Learns

Those of you who follow Valley Patriot publisher Tom Duggan on Facebook know that for the last 30 days he has been in "Facebook Jail" because Facebook executives didn't like the post above, his account has been locked so that he cannot post, like, share, or communicate in any way on Facebook until May 15th.

The post was a Wall Street Journal report, showing that officials in the South American nation of Chile have found that the vaccines they are getting from CHINA are not effective at the stopping the Chinese Coronavirus.

Looking at the pages of some of the people who shared the news story, none of them had the post taken down and none of them were locked out of their accounts.

The worst part of big tech censorship is that their so called "community standards" are vague and inconsistent. Nobody knows exactly what the rules are, and we suspect that's on purpose. This way, the censors at Facebook can silence anything or anyone they feel they want to, whenever they feel like it, even when others have posted the same thing with no consequences.

This seems like Facebook is not really censoring content but singling out users who do hold the same left-wing extremist views as the tech titans who run these social media platforms.

Big Tech monopolies are proving with their dictatorial policies just how important print newspapers, like this one, are.

They can censor what you post online, but they cannot censor the written word. ♦





Landing Ship). It took the LST twelve days to sail from California to Hawaii. In Hawaii they were sent to a Troop Transport, the USS Ormsby, heading to invade Kwajalein Atoll. The US Marines took the island after heavy fighting, and Beach Party Team 12 did not have to go ashore. The team rotated back to Hawaii for "rest and relaxation" (also known as R&R), then were loaded onto the USS Neville for the invasion of Saipan, in June of 1944, with the Second Marine Division. They landed at the south end of the island, so the Marines could capture a vital Japanese Airfield. Each night the ship moved out into deep water to bury the American dead at sea. After Saipan, it was back to Hawaii for two weeks R&R.

Arthur was assigned to a mine laying vessel, PCS-1379. "PCS" is short for Patrol Craft Mine Sweeper, Quincy, Massachusetts native Lieutenant E. U. O'Donnell USN-R was the commanding officer. With a crew of seventy, led by three US Navy Officers, the boat was very heavily armed for its small crew and size, with one .50 caliber machine gun, one 40 mm gun, two 20 mm guns, four depth charge projectors, one Hedgehog anti-submarine mortar, and two depth charge tracks. This formidable array of weapons was crammed into a boat only 136' long.

US Navy Signalman First Class Arthur Ducharme's last battle was the invasion of Okinawa during April of 1945. The Japanese defended their home islands with deadly Kamikaze planes and subs. After the invasion of Okinawa, (on Arthur's birthday April 1, 1945) the island was secured on June 21, 1945. Arthur was sent back to Hawaii for two weeks R&R. After President Harry Truman dropped the second atomic bomb on Nagasaki, and Japan surrendered, Arthur having seven dependents, a mother and seven siblings, was one of the first servicemen in the Pacific Theater to be demobilized.

After the war, Arthur worked for Merrimack MFG, making velvet. He then joined the staff of the now University of Massachusetts at Lowell,



Massachusetts, working as a watchman, Campus Police officer, and finally retiring as the school's carpenter. He and his wife Mildred were married fifty-nine years, she died at the age of eighty-four. The couple has four children, seven grandchildren, and five great grandchildren. Truly a "Hero in Our Midst"!



## Should Attorneys Have Immunity When They Lie in Court?

We requested "An Act to strengthen rules governing attorney conduct; penalties for misconduct." Senate Bill No. 1017 Presented by Senator Diana DiZoglio (By Request)

UPDATE: On March 29, 2021 this bill was referred to Joint Committee on the Judiciary; the hearing date has not been determined as of this printing.

Part of this article was initially in the March 2021 Valley Patriot. Since that time, the bill has been assigned Senate Bill No. 1017. (This was initially docketed as SD.2236).

We, Joyce Tomaselli and Gracemarie Tomaselli, know and have great respect for the many honest attorneys who take their oath seriously as "Officers of the Court".

We filed our petition with the Senate because it greatly concerns us that the opposing attorneys, in our case, were deceitful to the judges so they would win! They know they have "immunity" and even boast that they can do what they want to do!

No attorney should ever be protected by Absolute Immunity or Qualified Immunity when they have intentionally violated their oath. We truly believe that no one is above the law.

This legislation is of great public importance to preserve the integrity of the judicial process.

Our hope is that this legislation will help other Massachusetts residents to NOT go through what we have gone through in our quest for justice. We have



# Racism and the U.S. Constitution

This is sure to anger some “patriots”. We are in turbulent times here in America but, haven’t we always been? There is a lot of back and forth on social media, in mainstream media and in the talk on the streets about racism, voter suppression, and white privilege. And of course, the Constitution is brought up multiple times when addressing these issues. I’d like to dissect this.

The Constitution was ratified in 1778. Which was supposed to free ALL Americans and give them equal footing and yet, it did not. For some reason, white Americans thought it only applied to them and this sentiment still exists in many Americans today. Why did it take a war and another 77 years to pass the 13th amendment stating that slavery was abolished? Why did it have to actually be written out explicitly in our founding document? Why wasn’t it just a given? Most historians believe it is because the white establishment could not and would not accept the equal status of freedmen. It was unconscionable to many white Americans to consider a black person on the same political, social and economic level as a white person. Again, a sentiment that is still held by many.

It took 86 years to add the 14th Amendment that stated anyone born in the US was a naturalized citizen and has all of the rights protected within the Constitution. Again, why did this have to be stated explicitly? Are Americans that dense? And although this is in our founding document, the US had no trouble passing the Chinese Exclusion Act in less than 100 years after the passage of the 14th and building 10 internment camps during WWII stripping Japanese Americans of all of their Civil Rights, laws banning interracial marriages, homosexual marriages, separate but equal clause, Don’t Ask Don’t Tell, banning Transgender from the military and on and on. Laws were even passed in places like Indiana making it illegal for anyone to bring a black person into the state. A black couple was fined and arrested for getting married: the man for bringing a black woman into the state from another and the woman for crossing state lines as a black person. Was our Constitution protecting them then? Is it protecting all of us now?

After the Emancipation Proclamation, Civil War, and passage of the 15th amendment (82 years after the ratification of the Constitution) that gave voting rights to black men (women still could not vote), within 7 years over 2,000 black men held office and began making changes to raise the 4 million freedmen out of 300 years of oppression. And that’s when white folks started getting really scared. What if more and more blacks get into office? What will happen to us when we lose our power? And that’s when voter suppression began. If the Constitution really did protect ALL citizens and their rights, then this suppression would have had no footing. Instead, there was a concerted effort by the white male office holders to change how voting takes place to ensure that whites would remain in power. Identification was required. Identification requires money and literacy.

Something that most freedmen did not have, therefore, preventing them from voting in the very people who would represent and speak for them when it came to policy. This is still happening in America today and it’s called “securing the ballot”. It’s really voter suppression.

As it was, white America reacted out of unfounded fear. They were told endless false narratives about the freedmen and immigrants within our borders. Black men were both docile and violent, imbecilic and cunning. Black women were overbearing and overly sexual. The Irish were loud drunks, Chinese were full of disease, Italians were dirty, women were overly emotional lacking intellect. Today, gays and lesbians are sexual predators and will destroy the American family and now transgender people are abhorrent and will ruin sports. These images and messages are imagined and have been ingrained into our very genetics to the point where most can’t even recognize their own indoctrinated racism. It’s not our fault but, it is if we remain a racist nation.

Does anyone notice that, until recently, there has been little to no disparaging or negative rhetoric about white, straight men? Why not? In 2006 Tarana Burke uttered “Me Too” for the first time. And, for the first time, men (mainly straight white men) were called out for centuries of sexual harassment, abuse, and rape. And boy they did not like it. How dare anyone put men under a microscope! Tucker Carlson (a name I have to choke out) fuels the flames of white supremacy when he states that voter regulations protect the “culture” of America. He’s speaking about the preservation white male culture. He’s saying, in not so many words, that if we don’t “secure” voting that the country as we know it will be altered forever. Is that racist? 




